Impact

<u>Hevingham</u>

- Purchasing additional after school clubs delivered by Football in the Community has given the children the opportunity to participate in a variety of sports. This year the children have enjoyed multiskills and athletics. The clubs have improved the children's skills within sport and have helped them develop an active lifestyle.
- A new school Football kit has been purchased, increasing the profile of our team within the cluster. The children's self-esteem has risen since the purchase of the kit and team morale is high when representing our school.

<u>Marsham</u>

- The purchase of the Community playthings wooden blocks has improved the quality of our continuous provision for both our Early Years children and our KS1 children. The blocks have enhanced the children's learning opportunities, particularly in Physical development.

When using the playground markings the children are demonstrating key skills such as sharing, taking turns and explaining to the younger children how to play the games.
