Hevingham Ofsted report July 2014

Pupils' achievement in physical education has benefited from the primary sport funding. Pupils talk keenly of the sports coaching they enjoy and girls are particularly eager to compete against other schools in a range of sporting competitions.

Last year at Marsham Primary School, 35% of Reception children came into school at Expected Age Related levels in PE. 100% left with a Level 4 or above in PE. At Hevingham Primary School, 77% of Reception children entered at Age Related levels in Physical Development and 100% left at Level 4 or above.

Combining Writing with PE
