

Annual Governance Statement for the Governing Board of Hevingham and Marsham Primary School September to July 2023

In accordance with Government's requirement for all governing boards, the 3 core strategic functions of Hevingham and Marsham Primary Schools

Federation are:

1. Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction in order to ensure the best possible outcomes for all pupils.
2. Holding the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the schools and pupils.
3. Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

Governance Arrangements

From September 2022 to July 2023 the Governing Board Hevingham and Marsham Primary Schools Federation was made up of:

- 3 Co-opted governors
- 2 Foundation Trust governors
- 1 Staff governors
- 1 Parent governors
- 1 HeadTeacher
- 1 LA governor

We currently have 3 vacancies; 1 parent governor and 2 co-opted governors.

When appointing governors, we try to ensure that all sections of our community are represented.

The full Governing Board meet 5 times a year or more if the need arises.

The committee structure of the Governing Board from September 2022 to July 2023 has two committees:

o Management Committee – Which looks at the effectiveness of leadership and management, outcomes for pupils, personnel, welfare and health and safety.

o Teaching and Learning Committee – which looks at quality of teaching, learning and assessment, personal development, behaviour and safeguarding.

These committees meet at least once a term and report back to the full Governing Board meetings. We also have committees that meet if required e.g. Appeals Committee.

The current structure was established in 2018 following a review in July 2018.

Attendance Record of Governors	Attendance Governors have an excellent attendance at meetings and we have never cancelled a meeting because it was not “quorate” (the number of governors needed to ensure that legal decisions can be made).

The work of the Governing Board During this Year.	<p>The Governing Board has worked closely with and supported the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) as they have navigated the impact of Covid to ensure support for all members of our school community. Throughout this time the focus has been on the well-being and education of the children and support for the staff. The impact of 2 years of disruption has been significant and the Governors have worked closely with the Headteacher and SLT: reviewing and updating policies, discussing data and agreeing budget expenditure and targets. Monitoring visits have been undertaken by all Governors and visit reports are recorded and fed back to the Headteacher. Regular meetings regarding Safeguarding have taken place. Minutes of Governing Boards meetings are public documents. You can find them on our website or ask for them at the school office.</p> <p>We have worked closely with the school on ensuring the Vision and Aims of the school are evident and provide the basis for all aspects of school life.</p>
