## World Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) Awareness Week

We have been asked to share the following information –

What is Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR)?

Antimicrobial resistance occurs when microbes, such as bacteria, fungi or viruses, change in a way that makes the drugs used to treat us ineffective. This means that medication such as antibiotics may not work as well, and infections may be much more difficult to treat. By using antimicrobial drugs appropriately and reducing the chance of infections through vaccination and good hygiene practices we can reduce the spread of drug-resistant antimicrobials.
